

## UCAS AT EEB2 2022-2023

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES

- **PAPERWORK**

CATALOGUE FORM – to be completed and returned to [woluc@eursc.eu](mailto:woluc@eursc.eu) Please write clearly (especially your NAME!) and complete all sections. Remember you must mention any subjects you are dropping or changing at the end of Year 6 / beginning of Year 7. The Catalogue Form must be sent as a Word Document ONLY.

- I will contact each of your teachers to request a full report about you and how you perform in each of your subjects.
- You need to register on the UCAS website. Do this as soon as possible. You can find all the necessary guidelines to assist you in this process on the EEB2 website. Go to Secondary > Higher Education > UCAS. Follow the links. Look especially closely at UCAS ON-LINE HOW TO. This offers you a very clear guide about how to complete your on-line UCAS application form. Please study it and follow all the guidelines **VERY CAREFULLY**. You will be asked for a buzzword. It is: woluwe2023 Please note that EEB2 will not be officially registered with UCAS for 2022 -2023 until June. You can, however, go ahead with filling in your application form.
- Your personal deadlines for sending your completed on-line UCAS applications to me are:

Round 1 (Oxford / Cambridge / Medicine / Dentistry / Vet. Science) : **Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2022;**

Round 2 (All other courses at all other UK universities) : **Monday 1st November 2022.**

- **PERSONAL STATEMENT** : again, this is a **VITAL** part of your UCAS application. In your PS you must explain exactly why you are applying for your chosen course(s) and why you feel you are a suitable candidate. You must write 4000 characters (NO MORE). You should show your PS to ONE teacher in the English Section – no more than one! It is your responsibility – the clue is in the title: ‘PERSONAL’. It should be your own work.
- **Predicted grades** : these are compulsory in the reference I will write for your UCAS application and are your marks at the end of Year 6 (‘C’ Marks). These cannot be altered unless there are genuine medical reasons or serious extenuating circumstances. These predictions will offer you guidance about which universities / courses you may be eligible to apply for. Be sensible and realistic....
